REPORT ON THE 2011 NIMBIN COMMUNITY CONSUMER SURVEY Where Locals Source Their Food

On Saturday 4th June 2011 the Nimbin Neighbourhood and Information Centre with their Sustainable Nimbin Community Development Initiative held their second Community Forum on a Sustainable Nimbin. Over 100 people came along and participated (95 registrations) and of those people and some gathered from the street outside **59 completed this** survey. Not all surveys were evenly filled in with some people preferring not to answer specific questions. While it was reasonably easy to convince to be co-operative while we were sitting on the street, once they were handed out at the entrance to the Hall or left on tables it was impossible to do quality checks. Consequently nine people left out the last question which was on the back of the form

1. How much of your weekly food shopping do you buy here in Nimbin?

24% (14) of people bought most of their weekly food in Nimbin. 25.5% (15) said they bought over 50% in Nimbin 18.5% (11) said they bought less than 50% in Nimbin 27% (16) said they bought less than 20% 4% (2) did not answer that question

2. Which shops do you use?

Obviously people are patronising a range of multiple shops in Nimbin with the Emporium being the most popular shop with 48 people (81%) saying they shop there. Next came Nimbin Organics with 42 people (71%). 29 people (49%) said they use street vendors 27 people (45%) said they use the Hardware shop 22 people (37%) said they use the newsagents

3. Are you aware of the diverse range of local products available?

Most people seem to be aware of the diverse range of food available locally with 45 people (76%) saying yes. Nine people (15%) said no and five questions (8%) were left unanswered.

4. Do you actively source local produce over food from beyond our bio-region? Most people said they do source local produce over food from beyond our bio-region with 77% saying yes (46 people) and only 20% (9 people) saying they don't.

4. Continued: What local produce?

5. Do you shop at the local markets or roadside stalls for produce?

Nimbin 33 or 56%, Blue Knob Farmers market 28 or 47.5%, Roadside Stall 24 or 40.5%, Mt Burrell 20 or 34%, Lismore Organics Market 14 or 24% Channon Market 11 or 18.5% Lismore twilight market 9 or 15%

6. Do you find sufficient variety of fresh and organic food available in this town?

People seem to be evenly divided on the question of whether there is sufficient variety of fresh and organic food available in Nimbin. It may even make a difference what days they come to Nimbin as the street sellers are only there on specific days and often run out of produce very quickly. The answers reflect the even division of opinion with 27 or 46% of people asked saying yes and 26 people or 44% saying no. There were five people who didn't answer and one person said sometimes.

7. What are your key considerations when purchasing food?

This was a multiple choice question so some people ticked all boxes but most only ticked a couple. Two respondents did not answer this question.

Overall the main consideration among the people is that the food grown is Organic with 39 or 66% and Australian grown 38 or 64%.

The next most important considerations were both local Nimbin and Northern Rivers regional with local Nimbin on 32 or 54% and Northern Rivers regional 31 or 52.5%.

25 people chose quality and price as big issues with both those choices having 25 or 42% of the vote.

8. Do you grow any of your own fresh food?
